## CONTINUATION OF DECLARATION OF DISASTER


WHEREAS, the County Judge of COKE COUNTY Texas, on the 20<sup>TH</sup> of March, 2020, declared a local state of disaster for public health emergency due to the COVID-19 virus;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of COKE COUNTY, Texas, has extended the local state of disaster declaration;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE COUNTY JUDGE OF COKE COUNTY:

- I. That a local state of disaster was declared by the County Judge for COKE COUNTY, Texas on 20<sup>th</sup> of March, 2020, pursuant to Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.
- II. Pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the local state of disaster shall expire on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of November, 2020, unless renewed by the Commissioners' Court of COKE COUNTY, Texas.
- III. The Commissioners' Court of Coke County has made the decision to follow the guidelines of the governor of the state of Texas and his executive orders regarding the wearing of masks in public buildings and in determining at what stages to re-open businesses and other entities and activities in Coke County.
- IV. The Commissioners' Court of Coke County is currently mandating the use of face masks as a prerequisite for entering and for the duration of time spent in the courthouse. Said Court also strongly recommends the wearing of face masks in all businesses and indoor public places in Coke County.
- V. Pursuant to Section 418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the COKE COUNTY Clerk.
- VI. Pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the county Emergency Management Plan.
